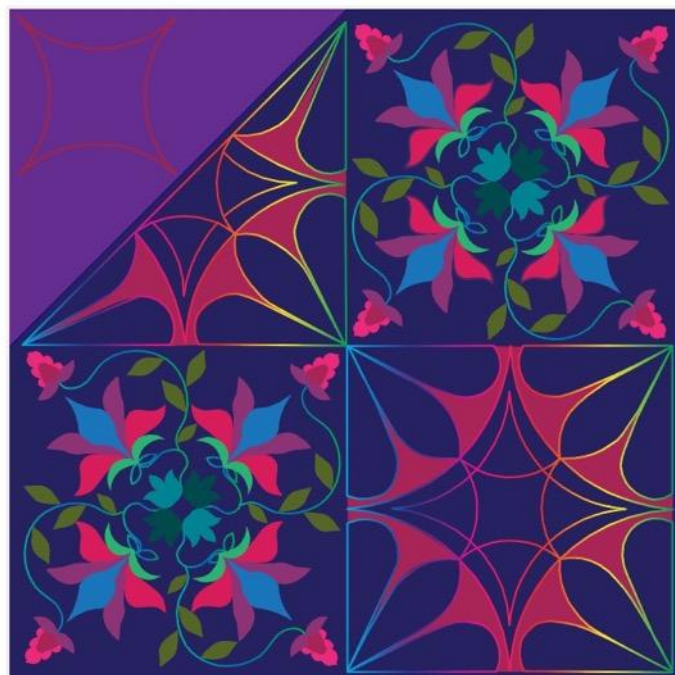
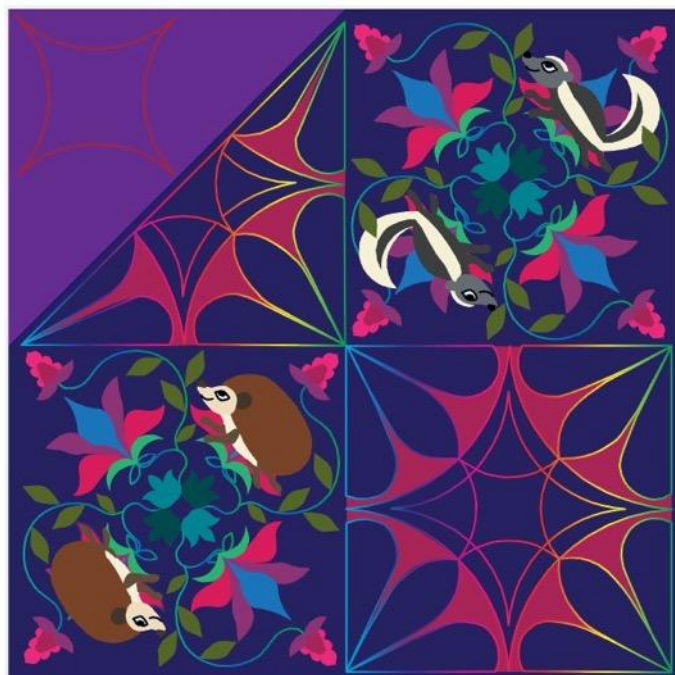

BLOCK 10 – HEDGEHOGS AND SKUNKS

The plan for the quilt is as follows:

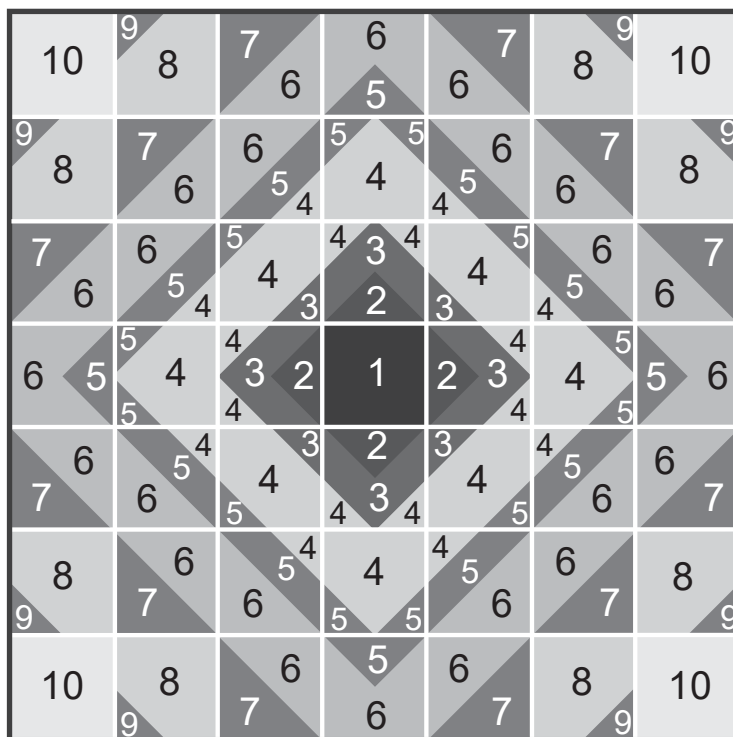


Hedgehog + Skunk Without Hedgehog + Skunk

Approximate Total Fabric Meterage/Yardage for Each Background Row 1-10

Below are **approximate** fabric requirements for the **background fabric** for each of the rows (1 to 10) in the whole Block of the Month – Woodland Wonderland Quilt. The fabric requirements listed below are a guide to the layout shown in this diagram only. This layout is only one example of how to create your quilt. Each row is a separate fabric.

Width of Fabric (WOF) refers to the standard width of fabric on a bolt (44" or 112cm). Refer to each block's instructions for individual fabric requirements.



Background Fabric Row 1

4x4 - 15cm x 15cm (6" x 6")
 5x5 - 18cm x 18cm (7" x 7")
 6x6 - 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8")
 7x7 - 23cm x 23cm (9" x 9")
 8x8 - 25cm x 25cm (10" x 10")

Block 1

Background Fabric Row 5

4x4 - 20cm x WOF (8" x WOF)
 5x5 - 43cm x WOF (17" x WOF)
 6x6 - 53cm x WOF (21" x WOF)
 7x7 - 61cm x WOF (24" x WOF)
 8x8 - 69cm x WOF (27" x WOF)

Blocks 3, 4, 5, 6 & 8

Background Fabric Row 9

4x4 - 10cm x 41cm (4" x 16")
 5x5 - 10cm x 41cm (4" x 16")
 6x6 - 13cm x 51cm (5" x 20")
 7x7 - 15cm x 61cm (6" x 24")
 8x8 - 18cm x 71cm (7" x 28")

Block 10

Background Fabric Row 2

4x4 - 13cm x 25cm (5" x 10")
 5x5 - 15cm x 30cm (6" x 12")
 6x6 - 18cm x 35cm (7" x 14")
 7x7 - 20cm x 41cm (8" x 16")
 8x8 - 23cm x 46cm (9" x 18")

Block 2

4x4 - 30cm x WOF (12" x WOF)
 5x5 - 53cm x WOF (21" x WOF)
 6x6 - 61cm x WOF (24" x WOF)

Blocks 5, 6, 7, 8, & 9

4x4 - 15cm x 61cm (6" x 24")
 5x5 - 18cm x 71cm (7" x 28")
 6x6 - 20cm x 81cm (8" x 32")
 7x7 - 23cm x 91cm (9" x 36")
 8x8 - 25cm x 102cm (10" x 40")

Blocks 11 & 12

Background Fabric Row 3

4x4 - 15cm x 79cm (6" x 31")
 5x5 - 18cm x 91cm (7" x 36")
 6x6 - 20cm x WOF (8" x WOF)
 7x7 - 38cm x WOF (15" x WOF)
 8x8 - 43cm x WOF (17" x WOF)

Block 2 & 3

Background Fabric Row 7

4x4 - 15cm x WOF (6" x WOF)
 5x5 - 18cm x WOF (7" x WOF)
 6x6 - 41cm x WOF (16" x WOF)
 7x7 - 46cm x WOF (18" x WOF)
 8x8 - 51cm x WOF (20" x WOF)

Blocks 7 & 9

Background Fabric Row 4

4x4 - 33cm x WOF (13" x WOF)
 5x5 - 41cm x WOF (16" x WOF)
 6x6 - 61cm x WOF (24" x WOF)
 7x7 - 71cm x WOF (25" x WOF)
 8x8 - 76cm x WOF (30" x WOF)

Block 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 & 7

Background Fabric Row 8

4x4 - 30cm x WOF (12" x WOF)
 5x5 - 35cm x WOF (14" x WOF)
 6x6 - 41cm x WOF (16" x WOF)
 7x7 - 46cm x WOF (18" x WOF)
 8x8 - 51cm x WOF (20" x WOF)

Block 10

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

4x4 (10cm x 10cm) Hoop

BLOCK 10 – MAKE EIGHT IN TOTAL

Fabric A - 15cm x 15cm (6" x 6") centre (*Background Fabric Row 8*)

Fabric B - cut 4 x 9cm x 9cm (3.5" x 3.5") top triangle (**this will be enough for eight blocks once cut into triangles – see note below**) (*Background Fabric Row 9*)

Batting 1 - 15cm x 15cm (6" x 6")

5x5 (13cm x 13cm) Hoop

BLOCK 10 – MAKE EIGHT IN TOTAL

Fabric A - 18cm x 18cm (7" x 7") centre (*Background Fabric Row 8*)

Fabric B - cut 4 x 10cm x 10cm (4" x 4") top triangle (**this will be enough for eight blocks once cut into triangles – see note below**) (*Background Fabric Row 9*)

Batting 1 - 18cm x 18cm (7" x 7")

6x6 (16cm x 16cm) Hoop and 150mm x 150mm Hoop

BLOCK 10 – MAKE EIGHT IN TOTAL

Fabric A - 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") centre (*Background Fabric Row 8*)

Fabric B - cut 4 x 13cm x 13cm (5" x 5") top triangle (**this will be enough for eight blocks once cut into triangles – see note below**) (*Background Fabric Row 9*)

Batting 1 - 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8")

7x7 (18cm x 18cm) Hoop

BLOCK 10 – MAKE EIGHT IN TOTAL

Fabric A - 23cm x 23cm (9" x 9") centre (*Background Fabric Row 8*)

Fabric B - cut 4 x 15cm x 15cm (6" x 6") top triangle (**this will be enough for eight blocks once cut into triangles – see note below**) (*Background Fabric Row 9*)

Batting 1 - 23cm x 23cm (9" x 9")

8x8 (20cm x 20cm) Hoop

BLOCK 10 – MAKE EIGHT IN TOTAL

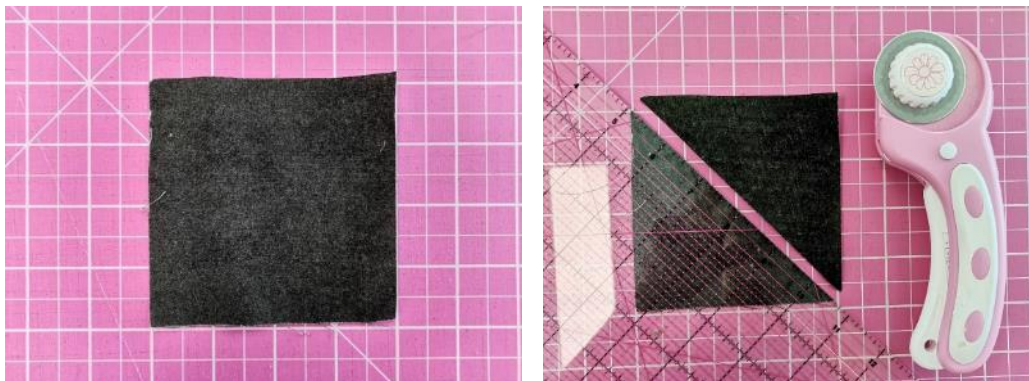
Fabric A - 25cm x 25cm (10" x 10") centre (*Background Fabric Row 8*)

Fabric B - cut 4 x 17cm x 17cm (6.5" x 6.5") top triangle (**this will be enough for eight blocks once cut into triangles – see note below**) (*Background Fabric Row 9*)

Batting 1 - 25cm x 25cm (10" x 10")

CUTTING HALF-SQUARE TRIANGLES

***Note:** To help reduce fabric waste, we have cut the square fabric pieces in half diagonally, from corner to corner, as shown below. This now gives us two half-square triangles.

INSTRUCTIONS

USING YOUR EMBROIDERY MACHINE:

BLOCK 10

Hoop up **cutaway stabiliser** in the hoop. Load design onto your machine. Use applique scissors for trimming the batting and fabric.



STEP 1 Place **Batting 1** on top of the hoop. Stitch the batting down. Remove the hoop from your machine and trim the batting about 1-2mm from the stitching.



STEP 2 Stitch the placement line for the centre.



STEP 3 Place **Fabric A** right side up on top of the hoop covering the placement line. Stitch down.



Remove the hoop from your machine and trim the fabric about 1-2mm from the stitching. Leave the excess fabric in the seams.



STEP 4 Stitch the placement line for the triangle in the top left.



STEP 5 Using the diagonal stitching, place **Fabric B** on top of the hoop wrong side up with $\frac{1}{4}$ crossing over the placement line and the excess pointing towards the centre of the hoop. Stitch down.



STEP 6 Fold over, hold taut and stitch down. Don't trim any fabric.



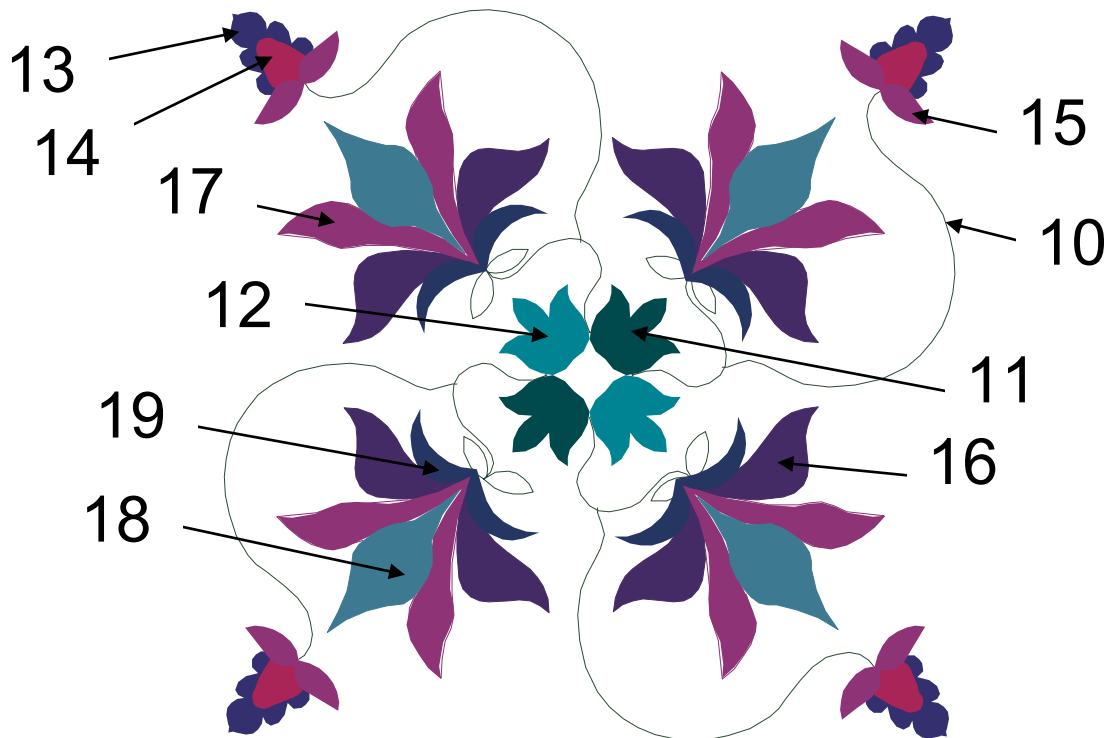
STEP 7 Embroider the red work on Fabric B.



STEPS 8 & 9 Embroider the quilting on Fabric A.

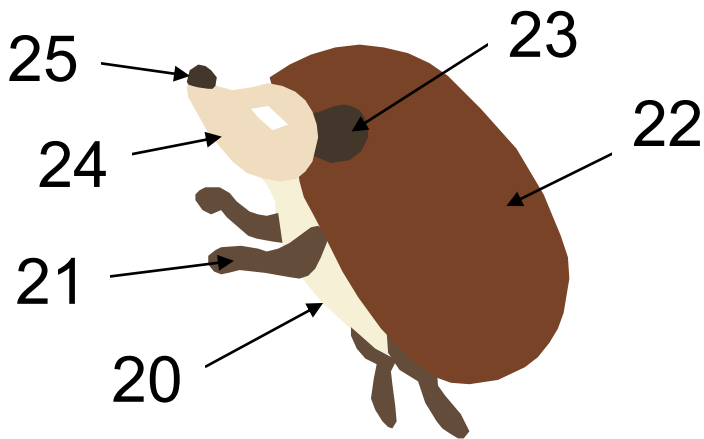


STEPS 10 – 19 Embroider the flowers as follows. The numbers correspond to the step numbers in the file:

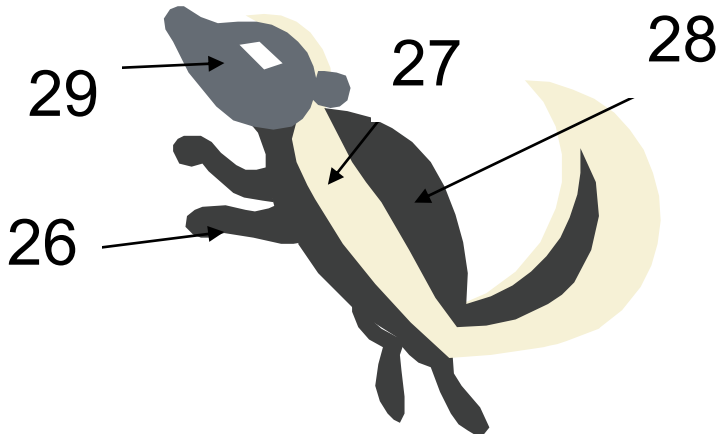




OPTIONAL: STEPS 20 – 25 Embroider the hedgehogs as follows. The numbers correspond to the step numbers in the file:



OPTIONAL: STEPS 27 – 29 Embroider the skunk as follows. The numbers correspond to the step numbers in the file:



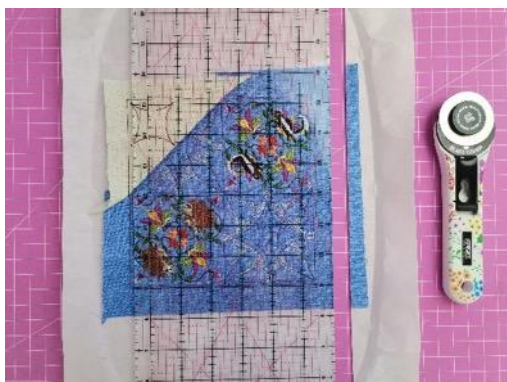
OPTIONAL: STEPS 30 & 31 Embroider the whites of the eyes, pupils, outline of the eyes and noses.



STEP 32 Embroider the leaves.



Remove your work from the hoop. Trim the seams to about ½ an inch. Make eight blocks for the quilt.
