Tiny Teddy Bear 4x4 5x5 and 6x6 Instructions

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

4x4 (10cm x 10cm) Hoop

EARS

Fabric A - 8cm x 13cm (3" x 5") front of ears

Fabric B - 8cm x 13cm (3" x 5") back of ears

ARMS AND LEGS

Fabric A - 14cm x 14cm (5.5" x 5.5") front of arms and legs

Fabric B - 14cm x 14cm (5.5" x 5.5") back of arms and legs

BEAR'S BODY

Fabric A - 15cm x 15cm (6" x 6") front of bear's body

Fabric B - 5cm x 6.5cm (2" x 2.5") bear's snout

Fabric C - cut 2 x 10cm x 15cm (4" x 6") back of bear's body

NOTE: if using fluffy fabric for the bear, be sure it is not too thick or too long.

5x5 (13cm x 13cm) Hoop

EARS (CAN BE MADE IN THE 4x4 HOOP)

Fabric A - 8cm x 13cm (3" x 5") front of ears

Fabric B - 8cm x 13cm (3" x 5") back of ears

ARMS AND LEGS

Fabric A - 15cm x 15cm (6" x 6") front of arms and legs

Fabric B - 15cm x 15cm (6" x 6") back of arms and legs

BEAR'S BODY

Fabric A - 18cm x 18cm (7" x 7") front of bear's body

Fabric B - 6.5cm x 9cm (2.5" x 3.5") bear's snout

Fabric C - cut 2 x 13cm x 18cm (5" x 7") back of bear's body

NOTE: if using fluffy fabric for the bear, be sure it is not too thick or too long.

6x6 (16cm x 16cm) Hoop and 150mm x150mm Hoop

EARS (CAN BE MADE IN THE 5x5/5x7 HOOP)

Fabric A - 8cm x 15cm (3" x 6") front of ears

Fabric B - 8cm x 15cm (3" x 6") back of ears

ARMS AND LEGS

Fabric A - 18cm x 18cm (7" x 7") front of arms and legs

Fabric B - 18cm x 18cm (7" x 7") back of arms and legs

BEAR'S BODY

Fabric A - 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") front of bear's body

Fabric B - 8cm x 10cm (3" x 4") bear's snout

Fabric C - cut 2 x 13cm x 20cm (5" x 8") back of bear's body

NOTE: if using fluffy fabric for the bear, be sure it is not too thick or too long.

Finished Size (approx.)

4x4 - body: 9.5cm width x 9.5cm height (3¾" x 3¾")

body including ears and limbs: 16cm width x 14cm height (6" x 5½")

5x5 - body: 12cm width x 12cm height (4 ½" x 4 ½")

body including ears and limbs: 19cm width x 19cm height (7 ½" x 7 ½")

6x6 - body: 14.6cm width x 14.6cm height (5 ¾" x 5 ¾")

body including ears and limbs: 23cm width x 21cm height (9" x 8½")

We will not be obligated to provide compensation to customers who have put our files through their software and the resulting stitch out was not as intended.

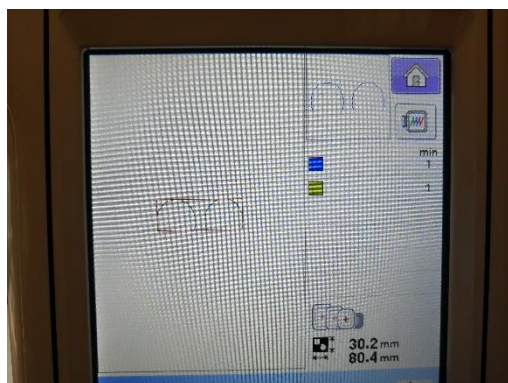

SEW THE EARS FIRST

Hoop **tearaway or washaway** stabiliser in the hoop. Load the pattern for the ears onto your machine.



STEP 1 Stitch the placement lines for the ears.



STEP 2 Place **Fabric A** and **Fabric B** right sides together and then place on top of the hoop covering the placement lines. Stitch down (this will be a triple stitch).



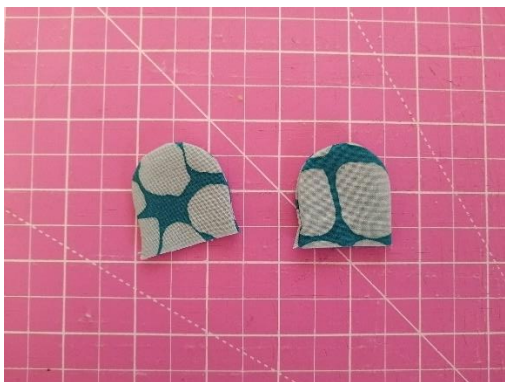
Remove from the hoop.



Remove the tearaway, if used. Trim around the ears roughly $\frac{1}{4}$ " (6mm) from the stitching, leaving about $\frac{1}{4}$ " - $\frac{1}{2}$ " (6mm -12.5mm) at the opening. Clip the curves.

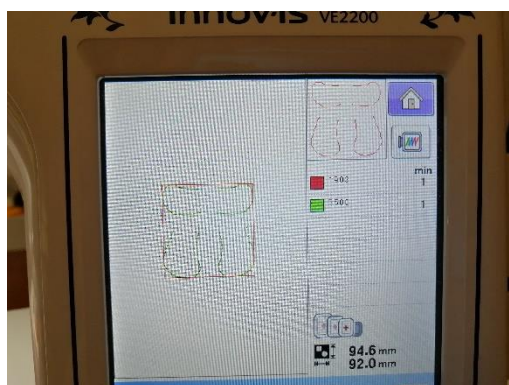


Turn the ears right way out and press. Put aside for later.



SEW THE ARMS AND LEGS

Hoop **tearaway** or **washaway** stabiliser in the hoop. Load the pattern for the arms and legs onto your machine.



STEP 1 Stitch the placement lines for the arms and legs.

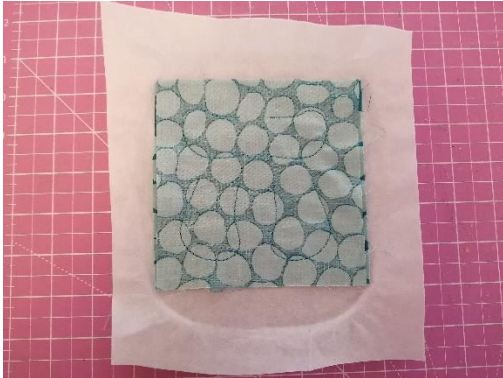


STEP 2 Place **Fabric A** and **Fabric B** right sides together and then place on top of the hoop covering the placement lines. Stitch down.





Remove from the hoop.



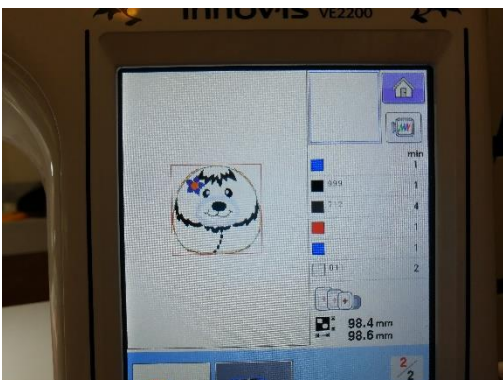
Remove the tearaway, if used. Trim around the arms and legs roughly $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the stitching, leaving about $\frac{1}{4}$ "- $\frac{1}{2}$ " at the opening. Clip the curves.

Turn the arms and legs right way out and press. Put aside for later.



SEW THE BEAR'S BODY

Hoop **tearaway** or **washaway** stabiliser in the hoop. Load the pattern for the bear's body. Use applique scissors for trimming the batting and fabric.



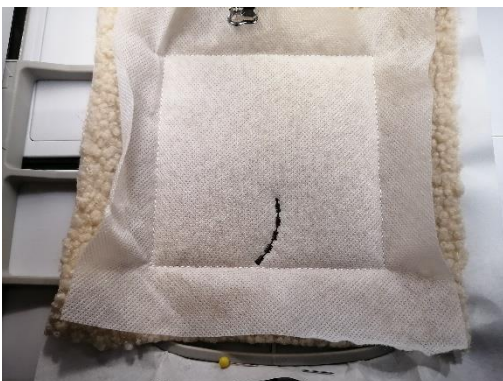
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STEP 1 Place **Fabric A** on top of the hoop **right side** up and stitch down.

*If you are using a fluffy fabric like we are, we suggest laying a piece of soluble stabilise (topper), the same size, on top of **Fabric A**. This stops any of the embroidery from sinking into the fluffiness of the fur.*



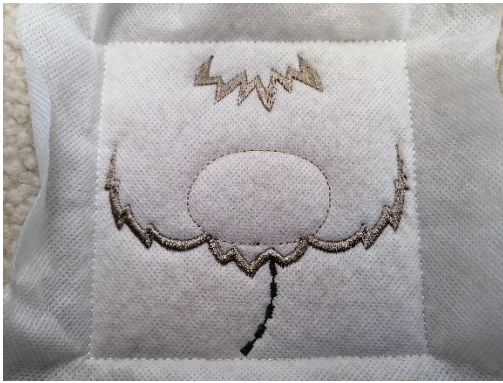
STEP 2 Embroider the stitching detail down the bear's belly.



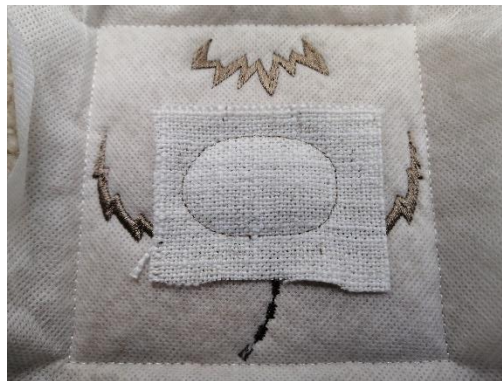
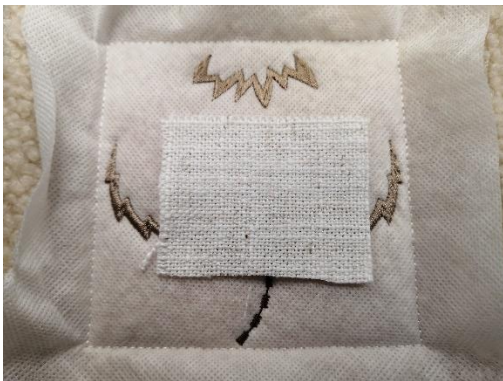
STEP 3 Embroider the fur detail.



STEP 4 Stitch the placement line for the bear's snout.



STEP 5 Place **Fabric B** on the hoop **right side** up covering the placement line and stitch down.



Remove the hoop from your machine and trim the fabric about 1-2mm from the stitching.



STEP 6 Embroider the satin stitch around the snout.



STEP 7 Embroider the mouth, nose, and eyes.



STEP 8 Embroider the whites of the eyes.



STEP 9 Embroider the petals of the flower.



STEP 10 Embroider the flower centre.



STEP 11 Stitch the placement lines for the ears, arms, and legs.



STEP 12 Place the ears, arms, and legs wrong sides up on top of the placement lines. Have the raw edges over the placement lines by about ¼" and towards the outer edges of the hoop. Tape each one down and then stitch down. You can slow the machine down and raise the embroidery foot, if you feel it is necessary. Remove the tape once the stitching is complete.



Lay one of your **Fabric C** pieces wrong side up on top of your worksurface.

Fold over one of the long edges about ½" wrong sides together. Press with the iron. If you are using fur or a fluffy type of fabric like we are, you will want to be careful with the iron. Place a piece of regular cotton fabric between the fur and iron. This will prevent the fur from melting.



Repeat this same process for the second **Fabric C** piece.

Place one of the **Fabric C** pieces **wrong side** up on top of the hoop. Have the fold meeting in the middle of the hoop and then the excess fabric towards the outside of the hoop. (See picture below).



Then place the second **Fabric C** piece **wrong side** up on top of the second half of the hoop. Again, have the fold about in the middle of the hoop, but overlapping the first **Fabric C** piece by about ¼." (See picture below)



STEP 13 Tape the two pieces down and stitch down. Once you have stitched the two **Fabric C** pieces down, remove the tape.



TAPE HERE

STEP 14 **NOTE:** There will be one more step after the border stitch, **DO NOT** stitch this step, just remove the hoop from the machine and skip this step. This very last step is here so the machine does not move to the centre of the hoop and get caught on all the limbs in the centre!

Remove from hoop.



Remove as much of the tearaway stabiliser as you can. If you used soluble stabiliser, do not remove it until you have turned out your bear.



Trim the seams to ¼ inch. (Make sure you clip the curves).



Turn the bear out to the right side through the opening.



If you used soluble stabiliser in the hoop or on top of the fluffy fabric, this would be the time to go ahead and wash it away (then leave to fully dry). If you just used regular fabric, now iron your bear.



Stuff your bear.



Hand stitch/glue the opening closed.



Your bear is now finished.
